Интересно и не всегда объяснимо, с точки зрения лингвистов, то, что язык постоянно изменяется. Самый частый тип изменений связан с тем, что слова в языке перестают иметь свое прежнее значение, после чего они либо употребляются в новом значении, либо исчезают из языка вовсе.

Бывает так, что новое слово берется из другого языка. Такие слова называют заимствованиями. Заимствований много во всех языках: языки, живущие по соседству друг с другом, легко обмениваются своими словами. Так, в английском языке много заимствований из старофранцузского (из-за завоевания Англии норманнами в XI веке).

Некоторые слова, однако, живут дольше, чем другие. В каждом языке есть своя группа «слов-долгожителей» (такие слова, как *отец, мать, вода, сердце, два* и т.д.). Такие слова очень важны для лингвистов, поскольку они позволяют установить, являются ли языки родственными.

Еще один тип изменений связан с изменением звучания слов. Активные изменения в произношении слов часто совпадают с бурными периодами в истории народа, говорящего на этом языке (завоевания, переселения и т.п.).
