Climate Change March

In London today, 20,000 people took part in protest marches and demonstrations as world leaders were meeting for climate change talks. The event was organized by the Campaign Against Global Warming.

A group of protesters on bicycles made their way to 10 Downing Street and delivered a letter to the Prime Minister demanding urgent action on climate change.

By three o'clock in the afternoon, Trafalgar Square was swarming with people and buzzing with activity. There was a carnival atmosphere with music provided by a samba band, a New Orleans jazz band and Scottish pipers.

Most protesters marched peacefully, but a small group of people broke away from the peaceful demonstrators. They smashed shop windows and tried to set fire to a supermarket. Five people were arrested.
