London is known for its many museums. For example, the British Museum is the world's oldest public museum. It is full of ancient treasures. London's art museums include the National Gallery, the Tate galleries, the Courtauld Institute Galleries, and the Wallace Collection.

The economy of Cardiff depends heavily on government activity and service industries such as health care, education, and tourism. The city is Wales's center of trade, shopping, banking, and insurance.

Sights to See

Bute Park is a beautiful big green belt running through the centre of Cardiff and lies just behind the iconic Cardiff Castle. It's a fantastic spot for a family picnic, as well as playing Pooh sticks off one of the bridges!

Visit this 100-acre open air museum and learn about Wales' historical past. St Fagan's National History Museum is one of Europe's leading open-air museums and one of Wales's most popular heritage attractions. It stands in the grounds of the spectacular St Fagans Castle and offers traditional crafts, native livestock and exhibitions for your intrepid explorers.

The Principality Stadium is the largest stadium in Wales and the fourth largest in the UK. The capacity is 74,500 spectators. An interesting fact is when the roof is closed it's the largest covered stadium in Europe.

In the heart of the Welsh capital, Cardiff Castle is an iconic landmark which is among the best castles in South Wales.

Interesting facts

The Animal Wall in Bute Park has sculptures of 15 animals carved into it.

It is thought to be the city with the most castles in the world.

Fact file

Edinburgh

General information

Edinburgh is the capital of Scotland, one of the four main parts of the country called the United Kingdom. The name Edinburgh comes from a Gaelic name meaning “Eidyn’s hill fort.” The city is known as a place of learning. Through the years it has produced many great thinkers and writers. Edinburgh is built on a series of hills and rocky ridges. It has a port on a part of the North Sea.

Sights to See

The oldest section of Edinburgh is called the Old Town. It developed around Castle Rock, which rises high above a valley floor. At its top stands Edinburgh Castle, the home of Scottish kings and queens in ancient times.

Another place of interest in the Old Town is the Palace of Holyroodhouse, where the rooms of Mary, Queen of Scots, can be seen. The palace takes its name from an abbey, or monastery, that dates from the 1100s. The palace was built beside the abbey in the 1500s. South and east of the palace spreads the treeless Holyrood Park. From the park rises Arthur’s Seat, a rock that is more than 5 miles (8 kilometers) around.

Edinburgh’s other main section is the New Town. Despite its name, it is more than 200 years old. Today it is the city’s main business area.

Between the Edinburgh Castle and New Town is Princes Street. The city’s main street, it is lined with hotels, banks, and shops. To the south are the Princes Street Gardens. In East Princes Street Gardens stands a monument to Sir Walter Scott, the great novelist from Edinburgh.

Interesting facts

Edinburgh Castle sits on an old extinct volcano.

Edinburgh was the first city in the world to have its own fire service.

Edinburgh Zoo is home to the world’s only knighted penguin!

Edinburgh is famous for its spectacular Hogmanay celebrations on New Year’s Eve.
