		Russia. It's a UNESCO World Heritage Site and holds around 20% of the world's unfrozen
		freshwater.

Visit		The largest island on the lake, known for its dramatic cliffs, Shaman Rock, and cultural significance to local Buryat people.
		Listvyanka Village:
		A popular starting point for tours, home to the Lake Baikal Museum and the iconic Baikal Seal Aquarium.

		Famous for its golden sandy beaches and "walking" trees, a picturesque location for
